Grade II Listed Buildings in Broadstairs & St Peter's

Introduction

The coastal town of Broadstairs & St Peter's is proud of its rich architectural heritage. Buildings range from the beautiful 11th Century Parish Church of St Peter the Apostle to the elegant 20th Century war memorials. They also include stunning 18th Century follies, cottages linked to the history of smuggling, the holiday homes of royalty and a famous 19th Century author.

In 2022, the Broadstairs Society decided that the existing register of Grade II listed buildings would benefit from a thorough review and updating of all the records. A small group of enthusiastic members agreed to take on this challenge. Between us, we visited the buildings, took photographs, established postcodes, checked the Historic England official listings and prepared a spreadsheet of the results. This turned out to be more complex and time consuming than we had anticipated. However, it was a fascinating project which has led to the creation of this record of our town's architectural treasures.

This was a team effort and therefore individual names are not routinely used in the documents. In the few cases where it was not possible to take our own photographs, we copied them from other sources and acknowledged them.

We hope that you enjoy reading the 2026 register of Grade II Listed Buildings in Broadstairs & St Peter's as much as we enjoyed producing it.
